PROFILE OF THE CLASS OF 2013

This profile mainly provides information about freshmen who declared intent to enroll in the Fall of 2009. The reporting of these objective data should not be interpreted to mean these are the most important criteria in the selection process. Other factors, such as secondary school curriculum and performance, special talents, extracurricular activities, essays, and interviews (when required) are critical to our decision making as well.

There are seven undergraduate colleges at Cornell: Agriculture and Life Sciences; Architecture, Art and Planning; Arts and Sciences; Engineering; Hotel Administration; Human Ecology; and Industrial and Labor Relations. Freshman and transfer applicants may apply to any one of the seven. Fall Regular Decision	Application due January 2	<i>Agriculture and Life Sciences; Hotel; and Industrial and Labor Relations:</i> Selected applicants are notified in early March. Other four colleges: Early April
Fall Transfer Decision	Application filing period February 15 to March 15	Rolling until June 15

* If Cornell is your first choice and you are applying for freshman admission, consider applying under the early decision plan [EDP]. Your application will be read in the fall, and you will be notified by mid December of Cornell's decision. Between 30-40 percent of recent freshman classes came to Cornell through EDP. Because enthusiasm for Cornell is considered a plus, early decision applicants stand a slightly better chance of gaining admission---a fact reflected in the statistics.

Remember that an early decision application is a commitment. You can apply under early decision to only one college or university. If you are accepted early decision at Cornell, you must withdraw any applications sent to other schools.
